

New behaviour Reward System

POP Stars at St. Marks

Following feedback from children, we are introducing an additional behaviour system at St. Mark's called POP stars. POP stands for Praise of Pupil and we want to reward children that show an outstanding quality. This might include completing a fantastic piece of work, having excellent behaviour, or simply being a superb member of class or school. When the child shows this quality they will be given a star on their chart in the classroom. If they reach the magic total of twenty stars in a half-term, they will get the coloured wrist band of the half-term and something special at the end of each term which they will be able to wear in school for the rest of that day. The colour wrist bands are:

Autumn Term 1 - WHITE Autumn Term 2 - YELLOW Spring Term 1 - ORANGE Spring Term 2 - BLUE Summer Term 1 - PURPLE Summer Term 2 - BLACK

The House Points system will remain in place to encourage team spirit. There now won't be a Good Day Trip but the winning house will now have 30 minutes of extra play with the equipment and resources at the end of the term.
