



Pupil Progress Update

We will not be conducting a parents' evening in the Autumn term as we have done in previous years. This is because the risk of Covid-19 posed to staff and children would be too great. In place of parents' evening, we will be sending out a pupil progress update via email to you on:

This update will give you a summary on your child's well-being, behaviour, findings of their baseline assessments for Reading, Writing and Maths and targets for your child to work on at home. Teachers will be contacting some parents for telephone meetings to discuss some children's learning and progress in more detail. You will be contacted if your teacher would like a telephone meeting with you. These will take place the week beginning Monday 2nd November.

FLU VACCINATIONS: THURSDAY 19th NOVEMBER 2020

Your child is due to receive a nasal flu vaccination offering protection against winter flu. We have sent the NHS consent forms home with your child this week. Please read the information attached to the consent form and complete the consent form stating whether you **DO** or **DO NOT** require your child to have the nasal flu vaccination and return back to school **ASAP** and at the very latest by: **Friday 23**rd **October 2020**.

YEAR 6 CLIMATE CHANGE WORKSHOP

On Thursday 8th October, Year 6 had a visit from James Trewby who works for Columbian Mission. He delivered a workshop to the children about climate change. The morning started with a zoom call with Marj, who is a missionary in Fiji. The children really enjoyed asking her questions and found out about what life is like as a missionary. On reflection, the children said: "She lives in voluntary poverty, she chose to have a simple life so that she can help others." Rhia. "Marj helps people. She promotes peace, justice and integrity." Moiz.

"Climate change is effecting Fiji because cyclones have got worse and they kill people now. The last one killed 46 people." Kiya.

We then looked at Laudato Si and what the Pope asked us to do to help our common home. We played charades looking at the key points - Annie and Zayaan acted out helping the community really well. After play, we went outside and completed private prayer, whereby we sketched the nature around us. "It was calming and peaceful praying outside and it was nice to draw what nature we have." Afreya.

After lunch, we worked in teams to create canvases that showed the themes from Laudato Si. Have a look at our school Twitter to see some pictures. When summarising the day to Mrs Linley, Tiya said, "We can't change the entire world from our classroom but we can make baby steps to make a difference."
