Expectations of Behaviour

When behaviour of children is not at the expected standard that is required at St. Mark's, we take action to combat poor behaviour and attitudes of children. Since the 8th March, we have observed that a few children have needed to be reminded on numerous occasions of our expectations for behaviour and learning. On occasions, children have not shown staff and others the respect they deserve, they have not followed instructions and they have forgotten to use their manners. I have already spoken to some individual parents about this and already, we are beginning to see some improvement. Thank you.

We are using lots of initiatives in school at the moment to promote good behaviour and to give children an incentive to behave well and work hard. For persistent behaviour issues, I will be arranging formal meetings with parents. I hope you will support us by working with us.

Lastly, I had a meeting with Fr. Vincent yesterday socially distanced in school and we are both hoping that it will not be too long before we will be able to celebrate Mass in school again. For now, we are focusing on planning the Sacraments for children in Years 3, 4 and 6 (please see separate piece in newsletter).

Work to paths on school site:

From next week, the school will be undertaking some redevelopment work to make the school pathways safer. This will involve the complete resurfacing of our main entrance pathways. While this work is being carried out, drop offs and pickups to school will be through the Kingsdown Avenue green gates only.

Year 2 only: drop offs and pickups will be through the car park green gates adjacent to the caretaker's house.

Only 1 of the car park gates will be open for pedestrians only. The redevelopment work will also mean that the normal access to the main school office entrance will be unavailable. As a result, for the duration of the redevelopment work, parents / visitors are requested to enter through the school car park gate adjacent to the caretaker's house. Your co-operation during the redevelopment work to improve our school will be much appreciated. While this work will cause some barriers, we are excited for the changes that will be made to enhance our pathways. The projected timeline for the redevelopment is 1-2 weeks. When completed, the new pathways will ensure the safety of all our children, parents and visitors when entering our school building.

We will keep you updated on the progress of the work.
