Prior to the Easter holidays, all children were given the opportunity to speak individually with their class teaching assistant in order to express their feelings about school, having been back a few weeks since the end of lockdown. We are pleased to say that the vast majority of children are really enjoying school and are glad to be back in their routines. Attendance has been great, and we can see how happy the children are coming into school each morning, which makes a huge difference. Moving forwards, we have re-introduced 'worry boxes' in each class, enabling children to express any concerns they may have any time at all, either anonymously if they wish, or named if they want an adult to speak to them specifically.

The other action we've taken is to spend some time this week talking to the children specifically about Coronavirus and the current situation with the pandemic, in order to tackle misconceptions and ensure that the children's minds are put at ease.
